



- 32 discussed the costs of the programs and the efforts to contain the  
33 costs to ensure the players fees remain reasonable.
- 34 3) Unfinished Business
- 35 a) Review of action items due from July 14 - none
- 36 b) 4<sup>th</sup> of July Recap – Mr. Ungar reviewed the finances from the event  
37 noting the net cost was consistent with prior years.
- 38 c) Stadium Lighting Project Update – Commissioner Bernstein noted  
39 the stadium lights were installed as planned. Testing of the lights  
40 was performed and the quality was very good with minimal spillage  
41 to neighboring areas. The new sound system was also tested and the  
42 sound quality was adequate, however, some expressed concerns  
43 about the quality (i.e., the quality was less than expected).  
44 Chairman Albert noted the MOU with the neighbors required a  
45 committee (including 2 neighbors, 1 Board of Selectman, 1 Board  
46 of Education, and 1 WPRC) to review any concerns that arise with  
47 the use of the lighting and sound system. He noted he asked  
48 Commission Ferdinand to fill the WPRC position on the committee  
49 and he graciously accepted.
- 50 d) BSP Irrigation repair status – Mr. Ungar noted that the electrical  
51 and water mains at Bisceglie Fields were repaired. The final cost of  
52 the repairs was \$7,000 (as compared to the \$5,300 originally  
53 expected). The additional \$1,700 of costs related to replacement of  
54 some of the common areas that need to be removed during the  
55 repair (the costs were split between the Town and Weston Little  
56 League).
- 57 e) Turf Field replacement – Commissioner Bernstein noted the turf  
58 field was replaced as planned and Sprint Field did a great job. He  
59 noted the field hockey lines still need to be cut into the turf (there  
60 are currently temporary lines) and Sprint is expected to cut the lines  
61 next year (at no additional cost to the Town).

- 65 5) Report of standing committees:
- 66 a) Administrative Committee: Mr. Ungar distributed (and the  
67 Commission discussed) the Activity Bottom Line Report for  
68 August 2014 and comparative information from August 2013.
- 69 b) Aquatics: Mr. Ungar distributed and reviewed the Aquatic  
70 Director's (Lynn Stevens) report on the Bisceglie Pond 2014  
71 Season noting a very successful year for the Pond. The report  
72 included several suggested repairs or improvements for the pond

73 area (e.g., repairs to the fence and walkway and potential addition  
74 of a sun shield in playground area). The Commissioners discussed  
75 the potential improvements and ask Mr. Ungar to look into the costs  
76 and suggest ways to address these areas.

77 Mr. Ungar also provided the Commission with an update on the  
78 pool painting and HVAC repairs. He noted the painting was  
79 complete but the contractor did not complete the repairs to the  
80 HVAC system (the system still needs to be connected). Mr. Ungar  
81 noted he is working on getting the repairs complete and will  
82 provide an update at the next meeting.

83 c) Fields: Chairman Albert updated the Commission on the Coley  
84 Field renovation noting fields look great, however, the benches in  
85 the dugouts are missing. Mr. Ungar indicated he would find out  
86 why the benches are missing and find a solution to get them back.  
87 Mr. Ungar also noted that he continues to look into a potential  
88 solution for fixing the Admin Basketball court (the paint on the  
89 court is severely chipping) noting one solution may be to remove  
90 the paint (he is looking into why the court needs to be painted).

91 d) Parks: No update.

92 e) Programs: Mr. Ungar distributed and reviewed Program Director's  
93 (Bill Schaefer) report on the 2014 summer camps. Commissioners  
94 discuss the details of the report noting the accomplishments of the  
95 program and their appreciation for all of the staff that helped make  
96 the camps successful in 2014.

97 Mr. Ungar also reviewed the summary of the Ladies Softball league  
98 provided by Bill Sneider noting another successful year. Chairman  
99 Albert asked Mr. Ungar to consider ways to get the word out about  
100 the Men's Softball league to hopefully increase participation next  
101 year.
