10 The Weston Parks and Recreation Commission (WPRC) held its regular monthly meeting
11 on Monday, June 8, 2015 at Weston Town Hall. Commissioners present: Eric Albert,
12 Dave Juneau, Brian Collins and Carl Bernstein. Public Present: None. Also present: Dave
13 Ungar, Parks & Recreation Director. Call to order: Chairman Albert called the meeting to
14 order at 7:50 p.m.

15 1) Approval of Minutes.

16 There was a motion to approve the draft minutes of May 11th by Commissioner
17 Juneau that was seconded by Commissioner Bernstein. Motion was approved. For: 4

19 2) Public Forum –None

20 3) Unfinished Business

21 a) Review of action items due from April 6, 2015 meeting - none

22 b) Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee discussion update – No report

23 c) WBA basketball survey-Chairman Albert explained the rationale for the survey to
24 all Weston basketball families. There were 47 responses returned and the survey
25 results will be discussed at the July 13th meeting. Dave Ungar will ask Adam
26 Tomanelli and David Levy if they could present a more user friendly report for
27 Commission viewing.

28 d) Security Cameras at BSP. Dave has had discussions with Chief Troxell about the
29 security of the Bisceglie-Scribner Park Pond and buildings at the ball fields and
30 potential of installing security cameras. Discussion is ongoing.

31 e) Other unfinished business – none

32 4) Report of standing committees:

33 a) Administrative Committee:

34 Fourth of July Fireworks – Mr. Ungar provided an update of the planning for the
35 July 4th Firework event. Commissioners agreed to a change in the fee structure for
36 the event. The new fees will be \$20.00 for car parking at the school parking lots
37 and \$5.00 for walk ins. Preferred parking will be available for \$25.00 plus the
38 purchase of individual tickets. This hopefully will help us close the financial
39 deficit we have historically had on the 4th.

- 40 b) Aquatics Committee:
- 41 Mr. Ungar provided an update of the planning to open the Pond. The Pond is
- 42 planned to be opening the week after school is out. Mr. Ungar noted this to be
- 43 Monday June 15th and passes are free for Weston Residents.
- 44 c) Fields Committee:
- 45 Mr. Ungar provided an update on the Bids for the servicing of the fields
- 46 (landscaping and grounds keeping) at Morehouse and Bisceglie Parks. Fapco has
- 47 been awarded the bid once again as they were the low bidder and have performed
- 48 these services well in the last contract that just ended. There were three bids
- 49 received.
- 50 d) Parks Committee:
- 51 Mr. Ungar reported that the Outdoor basketball court will be resurfaced with the
- 52 low spots leveled and cracks filled. This is an important facility that gets high
- 53 usage and has fallen in to disrepair. The Town has a new Girls basketball clinic
- 54 being offered on Thursday nights through the WBA beginning in July and the
- 55 court will be finished by then.
- 56 e) Programs Committee:
- 57 Mr. Ungar provided an update on the enrollment in the summer camp programs
- 58 noting that this year we do not have enough enrollments to offer the Soaring
- 59 Eagle Camp for children grade K through 3. All American Sports Camp and
- 60 Junior Eagle Camp are showing enrollment numbers more in line with prior years.
- 61 A new Swim Camp will be offered for the week after school ends and enrollment
- 62 is good.
- 63 5) New Business: Paul Levin is once again looking to host an outdoor movie night at the
- 64 Middle School fields prior to the labor Day Holiday. The Commission is in favor of
- 65 this program coming back to Weston after a few year absence.
- 66 6) Correspondence: None
- 67 7) Announcements: Congratulations to Commissioner and Mock Trial Coach Carl
- 68 Bernstein and the Weston Mock Trial which competed in the national competition in
- 69 Raleigh, NC. The Commission also wished Good Luck to Commissioner Brian
- 70 Collins on his upcoming cross country Bicycle race.
- 71 8) Adjournment: Motion to adjourn was made and seconded. Motion was approved.
