After several years' absence, we welcome back pony rides! The Pied Piper Ponies and Petting Zoo will be at the fair from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Everyone is invited to don a colonial era costume. Put on your tri-corned hat and your knickers or your homespun apron and mop hat. Add some colonial atmosphere to this year's fair as we continue to celebrate with our friends and neighbors.

The Norfield Fair was originally an event to bring Norfielders and the community together for a fun-filled summer day. While it initially subsidized the church's operating budget, all fair profits since 1990 have been donated to organizations outside the church. More than \$950,000 dollars have been given to others since 1990 - as a reflection of Norfield's
