

In Her Own Words

Margot Hopper

I was born in Würzburg, Germany on January 2nd, 1926. My mother was a housewife. My father was a traveling salesman. We were not rich people, but we were content and we had a lovely life. Everything was fine until November 1938, when the Gestapo came to the apartment.

I was sick, in my nightgown. I had fever. They came to pick us up in my home. November was not warm, and they made us walk through the whole town to go to the jail where my father was. They picked him up before us. He must have seen us. That was their torture. After that, everything went bad.

About two days later, the Gestapo took us to the office to tell us that my father was killed. I was only 11. After that a relative from Stuttgart took us in. The Jewish organizations there somehow found out about us and my brother and I were chosen to join the Kindertransport, the series of rescue efforts which brought some 10,000 refugee Jewish children to Great Britain from Nazi Germany between 1938 and 1940.

We went to Holland with the train, and they stopped someplace and they bought us white bread. We ate like crazy. We landed in Dover and were matched with a British family, who weren't kind. If she didn't like something she wouldn't give us anything to eat; she was wicked.

But after my mother was able to come we fled from there and ended up in front of Victoria Station, lost. A man came up and said, "What's the matter? Are you Jewish?" He wore a skullcap and we said yes. He said, "You're coming home with me to my house," and we stayed with them. Then, a year later, on July 13th, 1940, we were able to come to America.

Margot Hopper lives with her daughter and her family in Weston and has spoken to high school students about her experiences. She was interviewed by Jean Bennett in March 2016 as part of the Weston Historical Society's Weston Voices project. This and other interviews are available at the Senior Center and were made possible in part by the Friends of the Weston Senior Activities Center.

7/14: A Royal Night Out: PG-13: This 2015 British comedy-drama is loosely based on an actual occurrence that took place in England after peace was declared following World War II. The Royal Princesses, Margaret and Elizabeth want to go out on the town to mingle with the locals during the raucous celebration in London after the war. The Queen doesn't think it is a good idea but the King allows it after considering how it could help his upcoming radio speech to the public.

7/19 (Tuesday): My Big Fat Greek Wedding 2: PG-13: Toula and Ian were married in a lavish Greek ceremony several years ago, and many colorful characters came together to celebrate their nuptials. Now, another major wedding is in the works, and Toula and Ian are on the guest list.

7/21: The Lady in the Van: PG-13: Some true stories make the best stories. Miss Mary Shepherd, or "Miss S.," was an eccentric woman who lived out of a van. English playwright Alan Bennett met her in the early 1970's when it broke down near his home. With complaints by neighbors about her being parked on the street and interruptions to his work because he often witnessed children tease her, Bennett allowed her to live temporarily in the van in his front garden. After Bennett befriended her and started to see the world through her eyes, he allowed her to stay until her death 15 years later.

7/28: Mothers and Daughters: PG-13: Following a breakup, rock star photographer Rigby Gray discovers she's pregnant with her ex's baby and doesn't know what to do. She begins a project documenting what motherhood means in a series of photos following several different types of relationships between mothers and their children, the struggles they face, and the unrelenting love they have for each other.

8/4: Eye in the Sky : R: Helen Mirren, Aaron Paul stars: Colonel Katherine Powell is in command of a mission that is attempting to capture a militant Islamist group of extremists. When she discovers that the group they are monitoring is about to set off a suicide bombing attack, Colonel Powell changes the mission's objective to killing the terrorists, instead of capturing them. However, her commanding officers refuse to give authorization to a drone attack, because a teenage girl could be harmed.

8/11: Miracles from Heaven: PG: Christy Beam is a Texas mother whose whole life revolves around her sick daughter. Anna is a 12 year old girl who suffers from a rare disorder that leaves her unable to eat without a feeding tube. The family struggles to help Anna live a normal life with her illness. After falling over 30 feet out of a tree, Anna lands on her head. Instead of dying or being harmed in any way, she survives the fall, and Anna miraculously recovers from her disorder.

8/25: Mother's Day: PG-13: Sandy, a divorcee with two young children, has trouble accepting her ex-husband's new, much younger wife Tina. Miranda placed her daughter up for adoption at birth, but now an adult and engaged, Kristen sets out to meet her mother after some urging from her friend Jesse. Meanwhile, Jesse is surprised to receive a visit from her own mom and dad.

Some Medicare Billing Issues

Medicare bills by code(s) that come from the doctor/doctor's office. If the code for a treatment or for a procedure or for an office visit is forgotten or incorrectly entered the Medicare client will be billed for the supposedly non-covered charge. We have to be our own advocates – before you leave a doc office be sure the correct code(s) have been entered for any and all tests, lab work or visits. **ASK THE DOC** to double check to avoid possible future confusion and time expended trying to get a correction in billing. **Unpaid medical bills left over a period of time will be reported to the three credit agencies and could threaten your credit scores.**

Many Medicare-D plans in CT have some prescription meds that are “step” meds. These are meds that are usually very expensive or in a high tier (3 or 4) so that before a particular Medicare-D plan will consider covering any part of the cost of the med the doc must try other meds first. (Not all formularies in the 23 plans in CT for 2016 are the same nor rate the meds carried in the same tiers.) In a “step” situation the doc must submit paper work as to why this more expensive drug is being ordered. **The client must talk with insurance company that handles their Medicare D plan for very specific instructions.**

We all make general typo errors as do many hired clerks and assistants. **Be sure all numbers for Medicare, gap insurance and Medicare-D are properly recorded at a doc office, pharmacy or hospital.**

A hospital stay of three days or more qualifies you for rehab if it is necessary. If you have just been under observation in an emergency room Medicare will not consider you to be eligible for rehab and you will pay out of pocket. When you are in an emergency room be sure to understand if you have been admitted to the hospital or if you are just under observation. Do not be caught owing money unknowingly on this issue. Many hospitals are keeping clients under observation to avoid penalties if clients are readmitted within 30 days for same issues.

Current Local Telephone Scams

Several telephone scams are making the rounds. **NEVER SEND MONEY OR RELEASE PERSONAL INFORMATION TO ANYONE THAT YOU DO NOT KNOW.**

Calls from the IRS about imminent arrest/frozen bank accounts/suing/etc unless money is sent immediately. The IRS will never telephone you about any issues related to your taxes and the IRS will never demand money in such a manner. This is a fraud. Hang up and call the police.

The computer data scheme. A call from computer repair requesting access to your computer for a repair. Once granted all data is copied and held ransom. If payment is not sent the data will be deleted. Even when money has been sent the data is usually deleted by these thieves!!

The grandparent scheme. A call from a grandchild that they are in jail, friend is in jail, or another issue requiring immediate sending of money. You are usually told that you might not recognize the voice because of a cold. Do not send money. Hang up and report the call to police.


