VOTER REGISTRATION

Eligibility Requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- Resident of Weston
- At least 17 years of age (as long as you will turn 18 by Election Day)
- Completed confinement and parole, if previously convicted of a felony

Where can I Register to vote in Person?

- Department of Motor Vehicles
- Weston Public Library

Registration Deadlines for November 8, 2016 General Election:

Tuesday, November 1st - last day for registration by mail, online or in person; hand delivered mail-in registrations must be received by this date and mailed in registrations must be postmarked by this date.

Voter Registration Sessions:

General Registration Session. Tuesday, November 1st - 9:00 am to 8:00 pm. Weston Town Hall.

Limited Registration Session. Monday, November 7th - 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Weston Town Hall.

In person, for those seeking to vote in the November 8th election whose qualification as to age, citizenship or residence was attained since November 1st.

Servicemen - Special Session. Monday, November 7th

On written request received prior to 5:00 pm, members of the armed forces and former members discharged within the calendar year immediately preceding may be admitted as electors.

Election Day Registration:

- Weston Middle School, room H5
- 6:00 am to 8:00 pm
- Proof of identity AND proof of residence are required
- Voter registration must be entered into the State of Connecticut Voter Registration System by 8:00 pm
- Those in line or whose voter registrations have not been fully processed by this time will not be able to vote
- It is strongly recommended that you register to vote before election day to save waiting time and the additional requirements of Election Day Registration

ABSENTEE BALLOT INFORMATION

Any qualified registered voter may vote absentee **ONLY** if unable to vote in person due to:

- Illness or physical disability
- Absence from town during all voting hours
- Serving as poll worker in polling places other than their own
- Religious beliefs which forbid secular activity on election or primary day
- Active U.S. military service

To receive an absentee ballot, a voter must:

- Complete an absentee ballot application, available either in-person at Weston Town Hall or by download here:

- Return the completed application for processing either in person or by mail to Town Clerk, Town of Weston, PO Box 1007, 56 Norfield Road, Weston, CT 06883
- Absentee ballots become available to electors on October 7, 2016 for the November 8, 2016 General Election
- In order for your vote to count, the completed absentee ballot must be received in the Town Clerk's Office by Election Day

Special Conditions:

- If you have an unexpected illness or physical disability within six days before the polls close on Election Day, you can still vote. Please call the Town Clerk's office (203) 222-2616 for more information
- If you find you can vote in person after having voted by absentee ballot, you must go to the Town Clerk's office **before 10:00 am on Election Day** to request withdrawal of your absentee ballot. The Town Clerk will issue a signed statement to present to the election Moderator at the polling place so you may vote in person.

ENROLLING IN A POLITICAL PARTY IN CONNECTICUT

- New elector : complete **line 9** of the voter registration application
- Changing party affiliation: complete another **voter registration application** and check the box "Party Enrollment Change". You may do this online if you provided your DMV issued ID when registering to vote.
 - The two major parties are: Democratic and Republican
 - There are several minor parties in Connecticut including: Independent, Green, Libertarian and Working Family
 - If you do not wish to enroll in a political party, check **NO**. You will be an "Unaffiliated" voter in CT
 - If you are an unaffiliated voter and would like to affiliate with a party, you have until noon (in person) the day before a primary
- An elector who is changing from one party to another acquires party privileges three months after filing an application with the Registrar
- An unaffiliated elector who enrolls in a party acquires party privileges immediately
- Connecticut has closed primaries and caucuses, and only party members are eligible to vote in these
