On Sunday, January 10, there will be a special children’s program in the Weston Woods literacy caravan parked on the grounds of the historical society, 104 Weston Road. Katie Gay, an educator who is the daughter of “Weston Forum” Editor Patricia Gay will read funny animal stories to the little ones. Stories, crafts and activities will fill out the afternoon from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

On Sunday, January 24 from 1 to 4 p.m. the exhibition continues. The special storyteller will be Marcelle Soviero, editor-in-chief of “Brain, Child Magazine.”

In February, the historical society will open on Sunday, February 7 and February 14 from 1 to 4 p.m. Black History Month and Presidents’ Day will be celebrated on February 7 in special readings and Weston Woods videos for children. On February 14, Cupid will make a special storytelling appearance and to show the most beloved Weston Woods.

Parents and teens are invited to visit the Weston Woods exhibition during the afternoons that the historical society is open. There is plenty to see while experiencing this unique and imaginative exhibit of Weston’s special filmographer, Mort Schindel.
