

- 29 recent fundraiser. According to Mr. Evans' note, the event was
30 successful and FCP intends to repeat the event annually.
- 31 c) Revson Field Renovation Project Status.
- 32 i) Mr. Ungar stated that the project is still on track to be
33 completed over the summer, and that the specifications have
34 been approved by Mr. Ungar, John Clevenger of Weston
35 Baseball, First Selectman Weinstein and Dan Clarke of the
36 Schools.
- 37 ii) The project has faced some opposition in Town, and certain
38 townspeople directly contacted Dr. Dest, who had been hired to
39 oversee the project. Dr. Dest informed Mr. Ungar that as a
40 result of these contacts, he did not want the job. Thereafter,
41 Milone and MacBroom was hired to oversee the project. The
42 Commission and Mr. Ungar discussed at length the concerns
43 with people in Town negatively impacting the project.
- 44 iii) Mr. Ungar reported that John Conte, Town Engineer, did a
45 detailed elevation plan and construction plan and the specs
46 previously sent out to potential bidders were being revised. Mr.
47 Ungar and the Commission reviewed these plans and discussed
48 at length the work that will be undertaken.
- 49 iv) Mr. Ungar expects that new requests for proposals will likely be
50 sent out this week, with a due date of June 30. The plan is for
51 the work to commence before the end of July and be concluded
52 by the end of August.
- 53 d) Weston Park Project Final Project Status.
- 54 i) Mr. Ungar informed the Commission that Weston Park Project
55 has sufficient funds left in its account to pay for two of the three
56 parts of the Bisceglie-Scribner Park (BSP) walking trail
57 renovation. The other part will be funded out of P&R's parks
58 budget. The work is expected to begin soon with the hopes of
59 the trail renovation being completed before the end of the
60 summer.
- 61 e) Other Unfinished Business.
- 62 i) Weston Basketball Association Backboards at Admin. Court:
63 Mr. Ungar reported that WBA's gift of new backboards for
64 installation at the outdoor court at the Admin. Building costs
65 less than \$1,000, so the First Selectman was able to accept
66 WBA's gift on behalf of the Town, as per WPRC's
67 recommendation at its May 2011 meeting. The gift was
68 accepted by the First Selectman and the backboards have been
69 purchased by WBA and delivered. Mr. Ungar expects the
70 backboards to be installed very soon. In addition, Mr. Ungar

- 71 reported that the Admin. court has been resurfaced and
72 repainted and is in very good shape.
- 73 ii) Movie Under the Stars: Mr. Bernstein and Mr. Ungar reported
74 that as a result of the wetlands remediation project this summer,
75 the field between the Middle School and High School, where
76 the Labor Day movie night has been held, will not be available
77 this Labor Day. Because there are no other sites that are viable
78 alternatives, the event will not be held this year. Mr. Bernstein
79 reported that Paul Levin hopes to be able to hold the event again
80 in 2012.
- 81 iii) RecTrack: Mr. Ungar reported that the on-line registration
82 software will soon be delivered to the Town, and the P&R staff
83 will receive three days of training during the week of July 11.
84 The plan still is for P&R program registration to be on-line as of
85 this Fall.
- 86 5) Reports of Standing Committees and Resulting Motions.
- 87 a) Administrative Committee (Messrs. Albert and Uzenoff).
- 88 i) Mr. Albert announced that he has appointed Mr. Ferdinand to
89 be Secretary of the Commission, starting with the July 2011
90 meeting.
- 91 b) Aquatics Committee.
- 92 i) Mr. Ungar reported that the BSP Pond was cleaned and
93 repainted and is now filled with water. The Health Department
94 will be testing the water on June 20 and if the test results are
95 fine as expected, the Pond will open for the season on June 25.
96 Mr. Ungar further reported that a towns person has volunteered
97 to re-roof the lifeguard shack at the Pond.
- 98 ii) Mr. Ungar stated that the Middle School Pool will be drained
99 and regular maintenance/painting will occur in August, as in
100 prior years.
- 101 c) Fields Committee (Messrs. Bernstein and Juneau).
- 102 i) Mr. Ungar reported that the Bisceglie and Morehouse fields
103 held up very well over the course of the spring sports seasons.
104 Morehouse 5 will be reseeded over the summer.
- 105 d) Programs Committee (Messrs. Albert and Butlein).
- 106 i) Mr. Ungar reported that summer camp registration has been
107 fantastic; enrollment is full.
- 108 e) Parks Committee (Mr. Bernstein).
- 109 i) Mr. Ungar reported that the Town parks are all in good shape.
- 110 6) New Business.

- 111 a) 4th of July Event List.
- 112 i) Mr. Ungar provided the Commission with the list of events and
113 schedule for the July Fourth event.
- 114 b) Interview with Frank Peloso from Fapco Landscaping: Parks
115 Maintenance Contract.
- 116 i) Mr. Ungar reported that the Town received 7 bids for the
117 Bisceglie and Morehouse maintenance contract that begins on
118 July 1, 2011. The bids were opened on June 6 at 2pm at
119 Weston Town Hall by Mr. Ungar and Tom Landry. The lowest
120 bidder was Frank Peloso and Fapco Landscaping of Easton, CT.
121 Mr. Peloso appeared before the Commission to discuss his
122 qualifications.
- 123 ii) Mr. Peloso informed the Commission that his company has
124 been in business since 1982, and has been doing fields
125 maintenance since 1992. Fapco previously did work for
126 Weston, and also has significant fields maintenance experience
127 in numerous towns in Westchester County.
- 128 iii) Mr. Peloso stated that his company is fully licensed and insured
129 and has all the equipment necessary for the project. The
130 equipment is housed in Norwalk and Mr. Peloso resides in
131 Easton. He has read Dr. Dest's most recent report and is
132 comfortable that he will be able to provide high quality service
133 on this project.
- 134 iv) Mr. Ungar stated that he has received references from Mr.
135 Peloso, and has already heard back from one reference with a
136 positive recommendation. Mr. Ungar is waiting to hear back
137 from two other references. Mr. Ungar informed the
138 Commission that he is comfortable with Mr. Peloso and Fapco
139 doing the work.
- 140 v) Following the discussion with Mr. Peloso, The Commission
141 also was comfortable with entering into the maintenance
142 contract with Fapco.
- 143 c) Weston Little League Proposal for Outdoor Batting Cage and Field
144 Clay Boxes.
- 145 i) Joe Cina of Weston Little League (WLL) appeared before the
146 Commission to seek the Commission's approval of two projects
147 at the BSP ballfields. As a result of having extra money in its
148 budget from sponsorships, WLL would like to construct a
149 batting cage next to Bisceglie 2, to be paid for in full by WLL.
150 WLL also would like to construct small field clay boxes behind
151 the backstops of all three Bisceglie fields, to be paid for in full
152 by WLL.

- 153 ii) With regard to the batting cage, Mr. Cina provided a map that
154 detailed the location of where the batting cage would be
155 constructed – right outside the fence down the 3B/left field line.
156 The cage would be nearly identical to the already-existing cage
157 next to Bisceglie 1, although there would be low chain link
158 around three sides of the new cage to protect it. The
159 Commission discussed the pros and cons of having the new
160 cage and advised Mr. Cina to be mindful of existing irrigation
161 and power lines.
- 162 iii) Mr. Bernstein made a motion that WPRC recommend that the
163 Town accept the gift from WLL of a new batting cage to be
164 placed next to Bisceglie 2 subject to receipt by the Chairman
165 from WLL of a written project description that is materially
166 similar to that described at tonight’s meeting. Motion seconded
167 by Mr. Butlein. For: Albert, Bernstein, Butlein, Collins,
168 Juneau and Uzenoff. Against: None. Motion passes 6-0.
- 169 iv) With regard to the field clay boxes, Mr. Cina indicated that the
170 boxes would be very small and inexpensive to construct. They
171 would be similar to clay boxes already existing at other
172 ballfields in Town, and would house small amounts of clay,
173 mainly for use in the batters boxes.
- 174 v) Mr. Juneau made a motion that WPRC allow WLL to construct
175 small field clay boxes behind the backstops of Bisceglie 1, 2
176 and 3, as described by Mr. Cina at tonight’s meeting. Motion
177 seconded by Mr. Butlein. For: Albert, Bernstein, Butlein,
178 Collins, Juneau and Uzenoff. Against: None. Motion passes 6-
179 0.
- 180 7) Correspondence.
- 181 i) Mr. Albert read an email to the Commission that was sent by
182 Joe Cina of WLL to Chris Boisvert, of P&R’s maintenance
183 staff. In the email, Mr. Cina was very thankful for Mr.,
184 Boisvert’s hard work over the weekend to get the Bisceglie
185 baseball fields ready for the championship games.
- 186 8) Announcements, Remarks for the Good of the Order.
- 187 i) Mr. Bernstein informed the Commission of the recently-
188 appointed Charter Revision Committee in Town and suggested
189 that the Commissioners review the portions of the Town
190 Charter that relate to P&R to see if any changes should be
191 suggested to the Committee. Mr. Albert agreed to put this topic
192 on a future WPRC meeting agenda.
- 193 9) Adjournment: The Commission adjourned at 9:30 p.m., Juneau/
194 Bernstein motion and second. All in favor 6-0.
