Sitter Safety will cover all the essential skills you will need to become a trusted and responsible babysitter. Becoming certified in sitter safety is important because it provides parents and families with reassurance that their children are in good hands while they are away, and it gives babysitters the confidence and skills they need to provide quality care.

The 5-week program will cover:

- American Heart Association (AHA) First Aid Certification along with Hands Only CPR
- Infant and Toddler Child Care
- Emergency Situations, including a visit from the Weston Police Department
- Child Development and Behavior

There are three requirements to pass the Sitter Safety Course in order to receive a certificate:

1. Completion of attendance at all 5 sessions (unless parents notify course instructor)
2. Completion of a written final exam.
3. Supervised baby-sitting In-Service Project with the return of completed questionnaires.

2. Complete a timed event: swim 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7-10 feet, retrieve a 10 lb. brick, return to the surface, swim 20 yards on your back to the starting point, and exit the water without using a ladder or steps - all within 1 minute and 40 seconds.

There are three requirements to pass the Lifeguard Certification Course in order to receive a certificate:

1. Completion of attendance at all 3 classes
2. Pass written exam with minimum grade of 80%
3. Pass 3 final skill assessments

Scuba Diving Course
